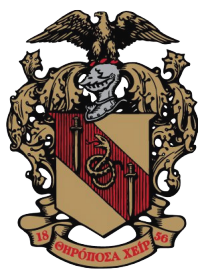

THE HELPING HAND SCHOLARSHIP

The Helping Hand Scholarship is awarded annually by the Beta Alpha Alumni Association of Theta Chi Fraternity, Inc. to select outstanding incoming freshmen and/or transfer students of the University of California, Los Angeles. The “Helping Hand” has been the official motto of Theta Chi Fraternity since its founding on April 10, 1856 at Norwich University, Norwich, Vermont. Θηρόποσα Χείρ is Greek for the Helping Hand and, so strong is our belief in extending the Helping Hand, the first letter of each of these Greek words was adopted in the naming of our Fraternity.

The maxim of Theta Chi Fraternity is “Alma Mater first and Theta Chi for Alma Mater,” and refers to one of the founding ideals of the Fraternity: Loyalty to one’s college or university as well as academic achievement are paramount.

The Helping Hand Scholarship, therefore, effectively combines our motto and our maxim. The Scholarship’s purpose is to lend a Helping Hand financially to recipients in order to recognize past personal, philanthropic, and academic achievement and to promote such achievement in the future.

Awards: There are a wide range of generous scholarships available, depending upon academic and personal achievement, leadership, and need. Scholarships may include up to any combination of the following:

- (1) Up to one academic year of housing at the Theta Chi Chapter House at UCLA (exclusive of summer housing, social dues, insurance, utilities, and meal plan).
- (2) Reimbursement for up to an academic year’s worth of textbooks.
- (3) Cash scholarships up to the sum of \$1,500 per academic year.

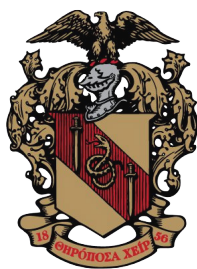
The housing portion of the scholarship will be limited by both the number of scholarship recipients and the actual availability of rooms. Subject to availability, scholarship recipients may also apply to renew scholarships on a continuing annual basis.

HELPING HAND SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT PROFILES

(1) _____ is an incoming freshman from _____ High School, where she was ASB President, co-captain of the varsity softball team, a leader in getting her HS accredited by the Western Assoc. of Schools & Colleges, and founded an organization that fund raised and threw events for a senior assisted-living center. (2) _____ is our first repeat Helping Hand Scholarship winner. She's a sophomore majoring in communications and biz-econ, and has performed the most community service/philanthropy work of any of last year's honorees, all while maintaining an impressive GPA. As a frosh, she served as the Commissioner of Fundraising for the UCLA Dance Marathon (which raised over \$410,000 for pediatric AIDS research), was a Summer Counselor at Camp Kindle (for HIV-positive children ages 7-12), and served on a USAC Committee organizing school events and promoting Bruin Pride.

(3) _____ is an incoming frosh from _____ High School, where she was the Valedictorian of her class; a four-year varsity letter-winner in swimming (three years as team captain, winning multiple league championships. 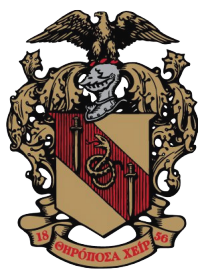

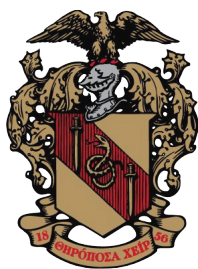
